- the quality of education being provided to students;
- areas for improvement; and
- new this year, the survey includes an additional series of questions—focused on stakeholder confidence in EIPS' priorities and strategic direction as a whole.

Collectively, the Division uses the survey feedback to help guide future planning, decision-making and strategies—all aimed at enhancing student learning and better serving the wider community.

As such, EIPS offers the pre-kindergarten PALS program in five of its elementary school locations. Applications are now open for free speech-language assessments for those interested in registering in the PALS program this fall. The assessment helps determine if PALS is appropriate for your child.

The Indigenous Peoples Atlas of Canada giant floor map was at our school last month too! The students had the opportunity to explore this unique map which does not share things you would traditionally find on a map. Instead, it shares a timeline of Indigenous histories, names of Indigenous communities, Indigenous languages spoken in different areas, and physical boundaries of treaties and unsettled territories. The students love to be on the map and learn about our history in an interactive way.
