1. Events & Celebrations

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

- Educational assistants have their first Community of Practice workshop this week – UFLI phonics and phonemic awareness for K-2 students and Gr 3-6 striving readers

- Turtle Islanders had a smudge and teachings about the broom dance and beading

- Sacred Teaching focus for Nov/Dec is Love

FAMILIES & ENGAGEMENT

- Fall Challenge had many participants. Over 90 entries or 20% of the school population (primarily in K-3) submitted for the draw. 10 students from Kindergarten to grade five won books, posters, and games.
